Although the map is specifically designed for persons with blindness and visual impairments, it is certainly a valuable educational tool for anyone and any classroom.

TACTILE INDICATORS

Two types of tactile indicators are encountered on the states of the U.S. Puzzle Map. A rounded tactile marker appears on each puzzle piece to indicate the location of the state's capital; these indicators are painted black. In contrast to these bump-like indicators, a low cylinder or tower-like indicator painted white appears at the location of the national capital, Washington, DC.

Puzzle Frame

The frame of the *U.S. Puzzle Map* provides helpful information, including mileage scales, latitude/longitude lines, braille state abbreviations, incised state boundaries, portions of surrounding countries, and finger holes. Each of the frame's features is described in more detail below.

Surrounding Countries

The surrounding countries of Mexico (northern portion) and Canada (southern portion) are painted light brown and permanently affixed to the frame of the map. Notice that the western edge of Canada is also shown next to the Alaska puzzle piece.

Latitude and Longitude Lines

The longitude and latitude lines are indicated in braille and raised print. These lines are incised to reduce tactile clutter on the map.

State Abbreviations and Boundary Lines

The postal abbreviation of each state appears in braille within the incised state boundary lines or area. Because of space constraints, the two-letter state abbreviations for Rhode Island and Delaware are not included and only a one-letter abbreviation is included for the states of Vermont (V), New Hampshire (H), and New Jersey (J). For correct state abbreviations, see section of Reference Guide on "Facts About the States."

Mileage Scales

Three mileage scales appear on the map's frame-one for the main map, one for Hawaii, and one for Alaska. The contiguous states and Hawaii are presented in the same scale. Alaska, however, is *not* in the same scale as the main map. While studying the map, keep in mind the following about Alaska and Hawaii:

1. Although it may not appear so on the U.S. Puzzle Map, Alaska is by far the largest state (656,424 square miles) in the Union with regard to area; it is over twice the size of Texas! If Alaska were represented in the same scale as the main map, including its Aleutian Islands (which are not completely shown on the puzzle piece), the state would stretch from Los Angeles, California to Washington, DC, the nation's capital.

2. Although Hawaii is really a long chain of separate islands that stretch far into the North Pacific Ocean, it is usually considered to be a cluster or group of main islands. These islands are represented on the U.S. Puzzle Map in the same scale as the mainland and are grouped together on one puzzle piece, but are painted separately.

Finger Holes

Four finger holes are located on the map's frame and aid in the removal of puzzle pieces. These finger holes are located in Alaska, Texas, Montana, and Florida. Simply reach under the frame and push the desired puzzle piece and/or masking overlay out of the frame (see description of "Masking Overlays").

MASKING OVERLAYS

Three reusable masking overlays are provided for assessment purposes. Simply insert the white styrene overlays into the frame of the puzzle to "mask" or hide the braille state abbreviations and incised state boundaries. Without access to the frame's visual and tactile clues, assembling the puzzle map will be more challenging and a true test.

- ▲ Find the states that border the Atlantic Ocean, the Pacific Ocean, the Gulf of Mexico, or the Arctic Ocean.
- ▲ List the states that are most recognizable by their shape. What features make them easy to identify?
- Estimate distances between various states using the mileage scale.
- ▲ Note if the location of a state can be guessed by its physical size or shape. Where do smaller states seem to be located? Where do rectangular states tend to be located?
- ▲ Talk about regions of the United States, such as southwestern states, mid-Atlantic states, etc. Insert only the states that make up each region discussed.

- Research additional facts about each state using a variety of sources, including the Internet. [See References on page 37 for examples of helpful books and websites.]
- ▲ Review directional concepts such as *north, south, east, west,* e.g., Which state is north of your home state?
- ▲ Review travel routes for vacation trips. For example, "How many states would youtravel through to get from Kentucky to Florida in the shortest distance?"
- ▲ Review locations of where natural disasters such as volcanoes, earthquakes, tornadoes, hurricanes, floods, etc., are likely to occur.
- Review the locations of famous trails: Oregon Trail, Mormon Trail, Sante Fe Trail, etc.
- ▲ Insert only the states that border Canada.
- ▲ Insert only the states that border Mexico.

- ▲ Research national parks (e.g., Yellowstone, Grand Canyon, etc.) and find their approximate location on the map.
- ▲ Discuss state climates. Which states usually have the warmest or coldest temperatures?
- Which states are known for being popular vacation destinations?
- ▲ Place states onto the map, one at a time, according to their statehood date (first to last) or state size (largest to smallest). [Keep in mind that some states are joined on the same puzzle piece.]
- ▲ Which latitude lines are visible on the map? Which longitude lines?
- ▲ Identify capitals of each state and locate them.
- ▲ Find the location of Washington, DC.
- ▲ Research the highest and lowest point of each state.
- ▲ Research the origins of state names.

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
